A Dab of Conservation

Good ideas never die; like perennials, they keep coming back. Dan Rieber came across this in a newspaper clipping from the 1960s.

"Conservation can be as little as a window box full of petunias on a busy city street or as big as Grand Canyon National Park. But when we think of the problems involved—junk yards, billboards, filthy rivers, air pollution—we're ready to throw up our hands and retreat to our own backyards.

"Oddly enough that's the place to start—your own back yard. If a block of neighbors on a city street holds a contest for the prettiest window box, that means a more beautiful America."

W75BA Wins Approval for Curb Extensions!

We are happy to report that our resolution for curb extensions on West 75th Street was passed by CB 7 in an almost unanimous vote on May 5.!

This is exciting news, and we will begin the process of establishing some temporary measures while the permanent extensions are explored further. (We have

applied for a \$2,000 Federal Highway Research Grant for our street safety efforts.)

Our strong advocacy has brought pedestrian street safety issues to the forefront. Everyone is to be commended for their role in this effort, with special thanks to Chris Greeno and Batya Lewyn, who testified on our behalf!

Crime Is Down on the UWS

Despite concerns that when the economy tanked, crime might escalate, the numbers are instead down for burglaries, robberies, car thefts, and other crimes. That was the reassuring news from Chief Inspector Keith Spadaro, commanding officer of the 20th Precinct.

During the lively Q&A session, members remarked on the precinct's swift, courteous response to 911 calls. This was exemplified by one member's experience when it looked as if his young son had gone missing, and the police were unsparing in their efforts not only to find the boy (and yes, he turned up!) but to be supportive to the parents in their fright and anxiety. Spadaro expressed pride in his men. He added that West Siders are alert, savvy citizens who notice suspicious activity and don't hesitate to it. That's a help in keeping the statistics favorable. He then us these direct numbers: (212) 580-6411, and for community affairs, (212) 580-6428.

In a sidebar discussion, a member cited her own unhappy experience and warned us to be alert at Fairway's checkout registers and to review register receipts before leaving the vicinity; under the new ownership, overcharges have been not uncommon..

End Avenue (95th–96th Streets). He is rushing to tear down these lovely buildings ahead of any possible calendaring of the proposed Historic District designation of West End Avenue. After the buildings are gone, the empty lots will sit—an open wound. W75BA sent the following message to Mayor Bloomberg.

“Time is of the essence, two more townhouses on West End (732 and 734) between 95th and 96th Streets have been granted demolition permits and will be torn down momentarily. We understand that Mr. Sackman wishes to demolish the buildings now,

to avoid the possibility of West End Avenue becoming an Historic District. We also understand that he does not plan to begin construction in the immediate future.

We urge you to order the Department of Buildings to rescind those demolition permits. The safeguards that will be put in place are reportedly grossly inadequate to ensure that 736 WEA, which has a common wall with 734 WEA, will not be damaged.”

Don't Let the Upper West Side Go South!

The West End Preservation Society has requested that New York City's Landmarks Preservation Commission extend the existing historic districts of WEA to include the length of the Avenue from 70th to 107th Street. The goal: to ensure that the architecture and ambience of West End Avenue will endure for generations to come, even in the face of major development.

That effort is already in danger from developers. It is reported that Alan Sackman does not plan to build for two years, but scaffolding has gone up around 732 and 734 West
